



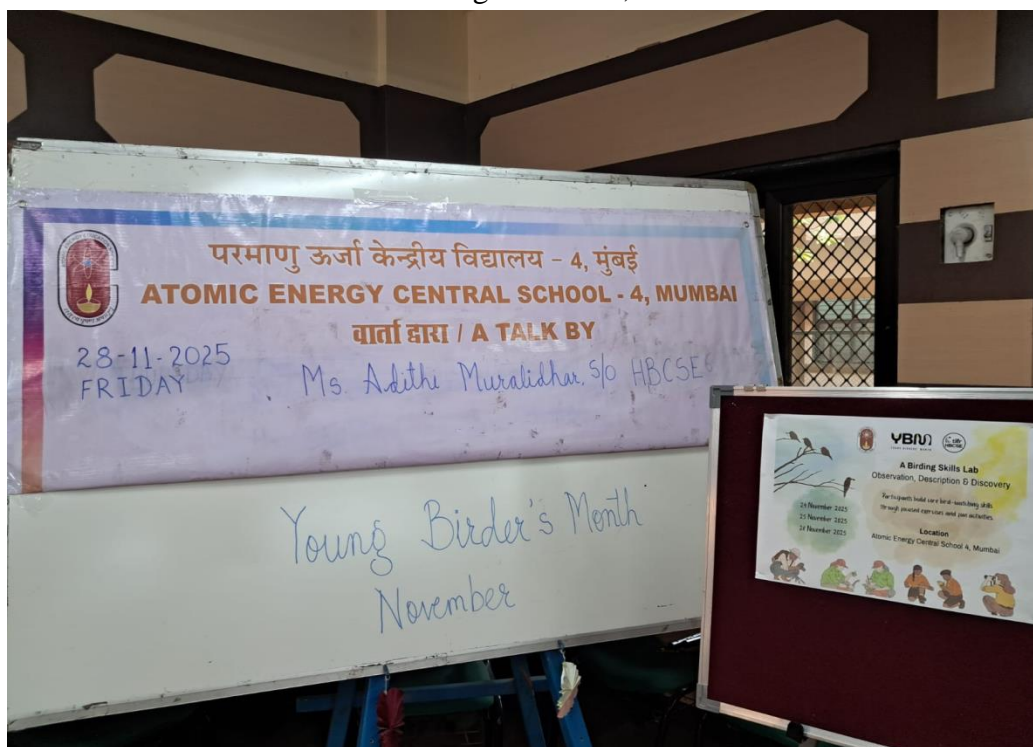

Young Birders' Month is a nationwide campaign in India, organized by Early Bird and WWF-India, celebrated in November to spark curiosity about birds in children. The month was chosen to coincide with the arrival of migratory birds, Dr Salim Ali's birth anniversary on November 12, and Children's Day on November 14.

A 3 day program was organised in our school for the Eco-club - Planet Pioneers, members of class - 5 and 12 on the following dates - 24, 25 and 28 of November 2025.

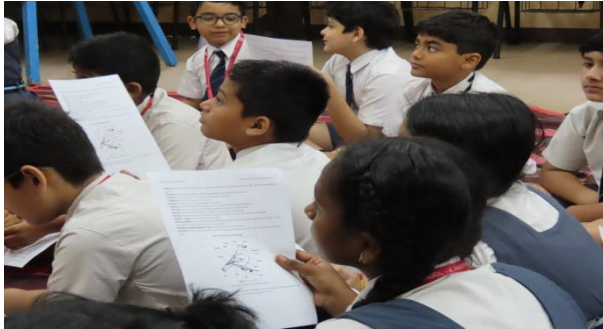
The indoor activities planned for the primary section were:

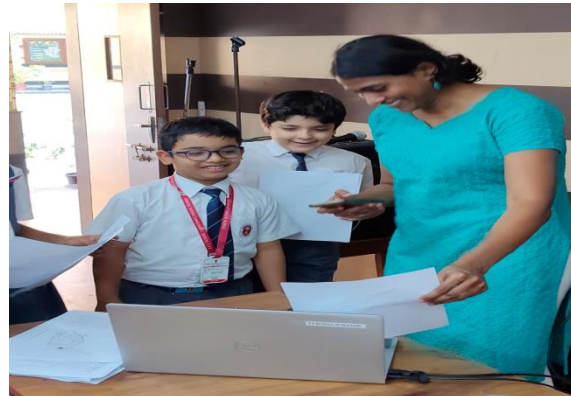
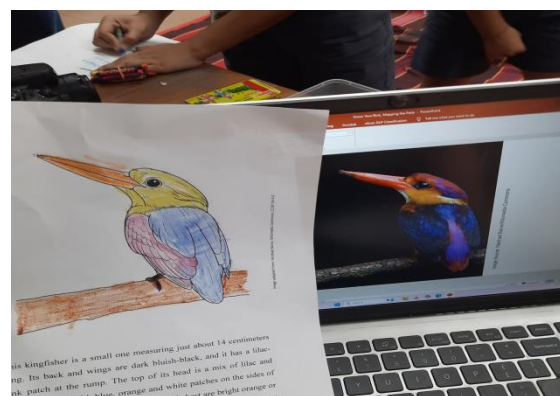
Identifying the parts of a Bird - Quiz

For senior secondary students more interactive as well as interesting outdoor activities were planned.

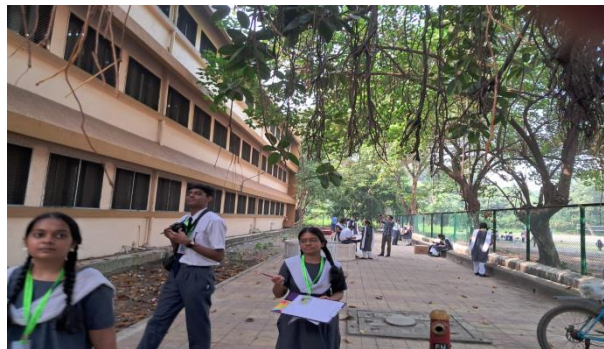
- To observe and to identify the parts of the bird.
